Update from Church Council

We are pleased to share that with the Synod's assistance, Zion will have continuity in worship leadership and pastoral care following Pastor Michael's retirement. Rev. Glenn Ludwig has entered into a *Covenant For Ministry* with Zion. He will be half-time and anticipates spending one-half day each week in the office, generally on Thursdays. Pastor Ludwig has led worship here at Zion in the past. Please welcome Pastor Ludwig to Zion!

An Introduction to Rev. Glenn E. Ludwig

Pastor Ludwig was ordained into Word and Sacrament Ministry for the Lutheran Church in America in 1973. During his 50+ years in ministry, he has served in rural, town, and suburban parish settings. For almost thirty years, he served as the Senior Pastor of larger congregations, first in Ellicott City, MD, at First Lutheran, where he served for 23 years, and subsequently at Trinity Lutheran in Camp Hill, where he was Interim Senior Pastor for three and a half years. His career also included serving as Chaplain to the University at Susquehanna University, his alma mater, from 1980-85, and as Vice President of Gettysburg Seminary from 2013-2018. He also served as Project Director for United Lutheran Seminary at Gettysburg to train senior pastors for service in the ELCA from 2012-23. During his retirement, he has served as an interim pastor for three congregations as well as a long-term supply pastor for three others.

He attended the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg and is a graduate (Magna Cum Laude) of Lancaster Theological Seminary in 1973, receiving the "Excellence in Ministry" Award, their highest honor, in 2000. Pastor Ludwig is the author of seven books, the most recent of which addresses the issue of long-term pastorates and was published by the Alban Institute. He and his wife, Stella, a retired elementary school teacher and former outdoor ministry director, live at Messiah Lifeways in Mechanicsburg.
